JUNE FUNDING REQUESTS

- ✓ 1. We Got the Brass, Frankfort, Germany: a continuation of their previous grant (\$200/month for 3 months) 200 / 3
- ✓ 2. American Deserters Committee, Montreal: \$280/month for June, July, and August to pay salaries to 2 staff people 200 / 3 mos
- ✓ ~~X~~ 3. The Amerikan Orphanage, Toronto: money (their budget is for \$12,815) to set up a "halfway house" co-op for deserters and resisters - meaning? - others doing it.
- ✓ 4. The Spark, Maine: a continuation of their grant of \$100/month for June, July, August, and September 100 / 50
- ✓ ? 5. Legal In-Service Project, Cambridge, Mass.: up to \$100/week for the summer for a full-time military counselor Alternates? No
- ✓ 6. Beacon Hill RAG, Boston: \$50-100/month for 3 months for their newspaper and literature expenses 75 - or 50 / 3
- ✓ ~~X~~ 7. Teller-Mendelsohn Film Project, Boston: \$500 to produce video tapes and short films for use as organizing tools No No
- ✓ 8. View from the Bottom, New Haven: \$400-500 to repay a loan Not now
- ✓ 9. Liberation News Service, New York City: help with the costs of a fund-raising mailing to the Ramparts mailing list No get loan
- ✓ 10. The RAP, Brooklyn: \$300 to get the paper going in New York and to support it until contributions start coming in again 100
- ✓ ~~X~~ 11. Fort Dix Coffee House Project, Wrightstown, N. J.: \$300 toward the purchase of a building for the coffee house Is it real? No
- ✓ 12. Wilmington Collective, Delaware: help with the expenses of their Youth Center in Wilmington (they need \$150/month for their newspaper and \$75/month for gas and electricity, literature, films, and miscellaneous expenses) 150 / 100
- ✓ ~~X~~ 13. OM, Washington, D.C.: funds to publish a special issue about Roger Priest's court-martial Some No

14. ✓ Yellow Springs Women's Liberation, Ohio: \$1500 in seed money to set up a Women's Center in southwestern Ohio (they need the following: 3 months' rent, \$225; office equipment, \$100; office supplies, \$100; traveler's expenses, \$300; literature and films, \$100; transportation, \$600; publicity and postage, \$75) *350/200/100*
- ✓ 15. Cleveland Women's Liberation Movement, Ohio: \$465 to set up a Women's Center and maintain it for 3 months (rent, \$100/month; office supplies, \$90; rental of an electric typewriter, \$25/month) *150/075/150*
- ✓ ~~x~~ 16. Red Licorice, Cleveland: seed money - old, still need? *NO*
- ✓ ~~x~~ 17. Columbus Draft Project, Ohio: money to publicize their existence, train more draft counselors, and provide subsistence support for their members *1300*
