Doctor of Laws, Honoris Causa

per totam vitam spem sustinuit quam, cum apud nos studeret, discipulus praestantissimus Holland, primus inter pares, editor commentariorum Tripod dicatorum, poeta suae classis, societati Phi Beta Kappa ascriptus praestitit. Hos honores ipse adeptus effecit ut sodalitas Alpha Delta Phi in summo honore esset. Ex quo tempore a schola Iuris Harvardiana gradum adeptus est, in via Murali quae dicitur peritia ferriviarum resarciendarum apud omnes homines insignis est. Hunc igitur alumnus, qui multos per annos socius primi ordinis Almae Matri maxima cum fidelitate servit, ad te duco — Leonardum Dawson Adkins.

This alumnus, Mr. President, born in the Eastern Shore of Maryland, Dean Hughes'

ille terrarum mihi praeter omnis,

has sustained in later life his excellence as an undergraduate when he was Holland Scholar, Valedictorian, member of Phi Beta Kappa, Editor of the Tripod, Class Poet, thus making his Alpha Delta Phi the cock of our walk. Upon graduation from the Harvard Law School he entered the practice of law in Wall Street where he is now recognized as the leading railroad lawyer in the country. The Roman jurists could well envy his legal skill in the field of railroad reorganization where he has gained the respect and esteem not only of his colleagues but of the numerous parties whose interests were involved. I present to you a son who has served his Alma Mater faithfully as Senior Fellow for many years – Leonard Dawson Adkins.

FRANCIS BOYER

Doctor of Science, Honoris Causa

Hic candidatus, Praeses Honorande, qui aulas academicas non modo Harvardianas sed etiam Cantabrigienses in Anglia frequentavit atque a collegio medico Hahnemann honoratus est, aedes pharmaceuticas quibus praeest ingenio naturaque harum trium almarum matrum imbuat et, quia hoc diploma accipit, quarta iam alma mater hoc collegium fit, id quod nobis homini est. Enimvero is, dum ingenti societati pharmaceuticae praeest, simul scientiae peritus, simul scriptor, simul generis humani cultor liberalis adversus geminas hominum pestes a tenero ungue belligerat, nempe aegritudines morbosque. Ne plura, ad te duco – Franciscum Boyer.

Mr. President, this son of Harvard and of Cambridge in England, honorary son of Hahnemann Medical College brings to the great pharmaceutical house which he heads the combined intellectual and spiritual qualities of his three Alma Maters, and honors us by accepting Trinity as a fourth. A life-time warrior against disease and human suffering, he fights those twin scourges as an industrialist, as a scientist, as a writer, and as a generous humanitarian. I present to you – Francis Boyer.

JOOST de BLANK

Doctor of Divinity, Honoris Causa

Hic ecclesiasticus, Praeses Honorande, confirmat tenebras tales quales hoc temporis momento in Africa Australi exortae sunt lucem Verbi non exstinguere. Is enim qui capellanus in exercitu Britannico se fortem esse praebuit iam nunc in urbe Capetown archiepiscopus et Metropolitanus in provincia Africae Australis caritatem Christianam inter omnes praestat adeo ut nobis in mentem illud Socraticum veniat: *ubi Deus me locavit . . .* Christianum in mundo turbulento fortem, episcopum qui, teste nostro episcopo Gray, dum calle montano anfractoque descendit, ut maiorem numerum gregis sui colat, velocitatem incredibilem sustinet, virum qua amantem qua amatum ad te duco – Reverendissimum Joost de Blank.

This man of God, Mr. President, gives witness to the truth that the darkness, be it for the moment that of the Union of South Africa, does not snuff out the light of the Word. Tested in courage as a heroic chaplain of the British Army he now, as Archbishop of Capetown and Metropolitan of the Church of the Province of South Africa, is carrying on his Christian mission of love among peoples of all races, reminding us of Socrates' sublime words, "when god gave me a station . . ." I present to you a courageous Christian in a troubled world; a bishop whose speedometer, as Bishop Gray attests, often reaches "95" as he goes down a mountain road of dust and gravel with sharp turns to be negotiated – to be closer with more and more of his flock, loving and beloved – the Most Reverend Joost de Blank.

FRANCIS OLMSTED GRUBBS

Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa

Hic alumnus Princetoniensis, Praeses Honorande, primum litteris Francogallicis in schola Loomis docendis inclaruit, cum discipulos concinnitate illius linguae erudiit atque ingenia indolemque eorumdem acuit. In bello mundiali altero, cum in classe munera praefecti obiret, quod mancos membrisque captos in integrum restituit, cui provinciae medicus Rusk imprimis dominabatur, collaudatus est. Cum ad scholam Loomis redisset, a tutoribus electus est qui conditori claro Doctori Batchelder succederet. Cuius scholae excellentiam praestantiamque non modo conservat sed schola aestiva condita ubi discipuli ingeniosi scientia quae dicitur provehantur famam nomenque auxit. Magistrum principem qui discipulos docet illud poeticum :

Suavior sudore redditur sapor
Gaudi,

simul vicinum qui vincula inter nos mirum in modum confirmat ad te duco – Franciscum Olmsted Grubbs.

This alumnus of Princeton, Mr. President, first distinguished himself as a teacher of French at Loomis School, inculcating in his students its tonality of beauty and substance of understanding. During World War II he was cited, as an officer in the Navy, for his services in Dr. Rusk's special domain, the rehabilitation of the disabled. Returning to Loomis he was singled out by the trustees to succeed its distinguished founder, Dr. Batchelder. He has not only sustained Loomis' excellence but has enhanced its name by his pioneering Summer Institute for Science which is maturing gifted students for advancement in science. I present to you a distinguished headmaster who is teaching his students the poet's truth:

*For toil doth give a better touch
To make us feel our joy,*

a neighbor who enriches our close ties – Francis Olmsted Grubbs.

WILLIAM PERSONS GWINN

Doctor of Science, Honoris Causa

Quod hic candidatus, Praeses Honorande, ab infimo loco ad principatum societatis anonymae United Aircraft ascendere potuit non modo ei ipsi qui sortem suam excudit laudi est sed nos felices sumus quia eminuit vir qui industriam suam ad patriae nostrae principatum defendendum ac viris augendas dirigit unde efficitur ut investigatio quae dicitur scientifica amplietur. Cum res Icaro male cesserit, huius tamen machinamenta in sublime ferentur. Honor igitur quem ei tributurus es indolem eius amplificato et ipsum ad pericula quae libertati nostrae minantur obeunda ac depellenda provocato. Hartfordianum igitur eminentem ad te duco – Gulielmum Persons Gwinn.

The rise of this candidate, Mr. President, from stock-clerk to the presidency of the United Aircraft tells a story not only of deserving tribute to a self-made man, but also of our good fortune in finding a leader who makes his industry a dedicated servant of our country's supremacy, a potent instrument in scientific research. Where Icarus failed, his rocket engines will soar to the "music of the spheres." Let the honor you are about to bestow on him be a tribute to his native ability at leadership, an inspiration to him to meet the challenge that faces a free mankind. I present to you an eminent Hartfordian – William Persons Gwinn.

WILLIAM LARIMER MELLON, JR.

Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa

Hic candidatus e familia clarissima ortus, Praeses Honorande, qui primo opera apud argentarios locata rem prospere gesserat, deinde latifundium exercuerat, denique triginta et septem annos natus studio artis medicinae se dedit. Instinctu afflatuque Alberti Schweitzer nosocomium e nomine huius nuncupatum in oppido Deschappelles in insula Haiti suis ipsius opibus construendum locavit, ubi, adiutrice uxore quae "propter operas egregias generi humano datas" a collegio Smith honestata est, in valle remota hominibus pauperibus, pro loco frequentioribus, medicinae egentibus ministrat. Ex tot meritis, quod sit maximi ponderis, nescio, namque non modo res gestae operaque in loco remoto maxime laudanda sunt sed etiam idem privatus quidem in regione Caribbaea humanitatem Americanam illustrans gratiam amoremque non modo sibi sed et patriae vindicat adeo ut Albertus Schweitzer quidam Americanus sit. Virum honore insigni dignum ad te duco – Gulielmum Larimer Mellon, Gulielmi filium.

After a successful background in banking, ranching, at the State Department this scion of a great American family, at the age of 37, entered as a "late bloomer" the Tulane Medical School. Inspired by Albert Schweitzer he built with his own fortune the Albert Schweitzer Hospital in Deschappelles, Haiti, where, with the aid of his wife, honored by Smith College for her "outstanding service to mankind," he is rendering healing service in a remote valley to a most underprivileged, overpopulated, and medically needy people. I know not what to single out, Mr. President – his inspiring life work in a primitive area, that he is one of America's beloved unofficial ambassadors to the Caribbean, that he is America's Albert Schweitzer – add them all up for a most signal honor. I present to you – Dr. William Larimer Mellon, Jr.

JAMES ARCHIBALD MITCHELL, '15

Doctor of Divinity, Honoris Causa

Hic alumnus, Praeses Honorande, curriculo studiorum apud nos confecto facultati collegii Sinensis Sancti Iohannis ascriptus est unde ad militandum pro patria in priore bello mundiali rediit. Cum ab universitate Yalensi gradu Magistri Artium exornatus est, ubi in disquisitione mentem scriptoris Lafcadio Hearn dissecuit, ut ita dicam, sacerdotio Ecclesiae Episcopalis sese dedidit. Ab ea bene meretur utpote qui in Seminario Theologico Virginiensi professorem egit; postea in urbibus Easton, Baltimore et Englewood paroecias administravit et iamiam in oppido Englewood ministrat ubi tres et viginti iam annos ut custos diligens libertatis civilis gregem suum curat. Alumnum igitur qui ubique, etiam peregre miris modis insigne huius collegii: *Pro Ecclesia et Patria* rebus suis gestis illustrat ad te duco – Iacobum Archibaldum Mitchell.

Upon graduation, Mr. President, this alumnus was on the faculty of St. John's University in China, returning to serve his country in World War I. After exploring, in a master's thesis at Yale, the mind of that literary "impressionist" Lafcadio Hearn, he entered upon a life work of ministry in our Episcopal Church, serving it faithfully and with distinction as Professor of Practical Theology at the Virginia Theological Seminary and in three parishes; Easton, Baltimore, and now in Englewood where for twenty-seven years he has served his flock and his community as watchful custodian of civil liberty. I present to you an alumnus who, in every community in which he has lived, and in a foreign land, has demonstrated our College's motto – Pro Ecclesia et Patria – in his life and activities – James Archibald Mitchell.

HOWARD ARCHIBALD RUSK

Doctor of Science, Honoris Causa

Meminimus, Praeses Honorande, illum languidum ad piscinam probaticam Hierosolymis querentem: "Domine, hominem non habeo ut cum turbata fuerit aqua mittat me in piscinam." Virum honoribus iam cumulatum ut qui milites in bello mundiali altero et in Corea vulneribus confectos vel mancos in valetudinem restituit et ceteras gentes idem facere docuit hic honoramus. Gaudemus quod adest quodque vita eius insignes iuvenes humaniore quodam spiritu afflare potest. Medicum igitur arte peritiaque sanandi clarum, profectu artis medicinae in Actis Diurnis *New York Times* interpretando insignem, studio amoreque generis humani praestantissimum ad te duco – Howardum Archibaldum Rusk.

We well remember, Mr. President, the plaintive cry of the maimed man by the healing pool of Bethesda, "Lord, I have no man to put me in the pool." We honor the much honored man for his pioneering work in rehabilitation among our physically disabled soldiers in World War II and Korea, for the dissemination of his rehabilitation training program to the rest of the world. We joy in his presence here and in the inspiration which his life of dedication may give to a new generation. I therefore present to you a physician who will live in the annals of medicine for his blessed healing; for his interpretation of medical progress in The New York Times; for his continuous selfless devotion to fellow men – Dr. Howard Archibald Rusk.
