Present: Hilde Hein (Chairperson), Wayne O'Neil, Frank Joyce, Paul Lauter, Larry Thomas, Una Claffey.

The financial report and office report were given by Una Claffey. She introduced the new staff person, Larry Thomas (see enclosed letter). She also gave a report on a regional conference of the Puerto Rican Socialist Party to which Resist had been invited. The conference was a report by the Boston leadership of the party on the party's work of consolidation and expansion in the previous year. An address was also given by Digna Sanchez, Secretary of Press and Propoganda for the party in the United States.

A letter written by Bob Zevin for a fundraising mailing to our contributors' list was also discussed. It was decided that Hilde Hein should rewrite portions of it to reflect Resist's past and future role in the ongoing political struggle in the U.S.

The newsletter was next discussed. It was decided that a piece submitted by Hans Koning was not suitable for publication by Resist. It was agreed that both Paul Lauter and Hank Rosemont should write seperate pieces on higher education. For the series on the current tendencies within the left it was agreed that Arthur Kinoy be approached for a piece for the next newsletter, and that in addition to Frank Joyce's piece on the building of a Marxist Leninist party someone from Resist should write up the spontaneous tendency.

A brief discussion on the projected Resist conference followed. Frank Joyce reported that the Motor City Labor League has committed itself to working for a party building conference to be held in September but that does not preclude its participation in other conferences. He also said that MCLL has just emerged from a period of ideological struggle and consolidation and has produced a paper outlining its position and way forward.
