






Trinity College.

THIS College has no medical, law, divinity, or other professional school or department connected with it; but is intended to give a Liberal Education, adapted to fit young men to enter most advantageously upon the study of the Learned Professions after graduation. By a Liberal Education is meant a non-professional education, conducted without reference to any future particular profession, calling, or special pursuit on the part of the student in question, and designed not to make men specially clergymen, lawyers, physicians, soldiers, merchants, or engineers, but so to train and educate the mental faculties as to put them into their most efficient condition, and to qualify a student to enter with success upon the study of any of the professions, or upon any other pursuit in life.

EXPENSES.

The amount of the Treasurer's bills each year is as follows:

Board is furnished in the College Dining-hall at \$4.50 per week. To this must be added laundry charges, together with the expense of books, furniture, clothing, travel, and society fees, which vary according to the taste and habits of the student, and of which no estimate can be given.

SCHOLARSHIPS.

The amount of the Treasurer's bills can be considerably reduced to holders of scholarships. The income of these scholarships, which are of different values, is placed to the credit of students of limited means, and serves to meet the charges for tuition and room-rent in whole or in part.

For holders of scholarships remitting the entire charges for tuition and room-rent, the Treasurer's bill is reduced to \$42.50; and the necessary expenses of such students, including board and other personal items, will not exceed \$250 or \$300 a year.

EXAMINATIONS FOR ADMISSION.

Two Examinations for Admission are held at the College in each year: the first at the end of June, in Commencement Week; and the second in September, immediately before the beginning of Christmas Term.

Examinations for admission will also be held on the specified days of June in New York, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Chicago, and San Francisco, and in other places, due notice of which will be given.

Commencement is Thursday, June 30, 1887.

ROOMS AND BUILDINGS.

The new buildings were commenced in 1875. They are thoroughly drained, well ventilated, and unsurpassed for convenience and comfort. In 1881 the Northam gateway was begun, and the western side of the great quadrangle is now completed. Easy access from the city is secured by means of street-cars running to the College grounds. An excellent athletic ground is provided for ball playing and other out-door sports; there are also several tennis courts, and the new gymnasium, now in course of erection, will be completed in the Spring. The rooms are arranged so as to provide for two students rooming together, a common study and separate bedrooms. They are heated by steam, and lighted by gas, and ventilation is secured by open fire-places. Water is carried to every floor.

The site of the buildings is remarkable for its healthfulness.



Editorial.

"Whole ages have fled and their works decayed,
And nations have scattered been;
But the stout old Ivy shall never fade
From its hale and hearty green."
* * * * *
"Creeping on where time has been,
A rare old plant is the Ivy green."

And now, "in the course of college events," it becomes the duty of the class of '88 to place before its friends their volume of the *Ivy*. To them we would extend a cordial greeting. In our work of publishing this volume we have not merely picked off the dead leaves, and tied up the stray branches, but have endeavored to train each branch and leaf a-right, to infuse life into the whole, and to provide for it a substantial cover which will not yield to the first rude touch. May we not entertain the hope that this *Ivy* will, like the plant from which it takes its name, send out its leaves in all directions, and adorn the walls of our Alma Mater, to which it clings for life and strength? Expressing this hope, we pass on to briefly chronicle the important events which have taken place since the appearance of the *Ivy* last year.

First in importance is the largely increased number of students. This increase in numbers shows the advance made by the college in the past few years, and argues most propitiously for its future prospects. The active interest taken in the college by the various Associations of the Alumni is a source of no little advantage, as is shown by their ready response to a call for money for the erection of a new Gymnasium, which is already well above its foundation-walls, and gives promise of being a handsome and commodious structure.

During the coming year a fully equipped science building will be erected. This will not only accommodate the increasing numbers of students in the science courses, but will relieve the over-crowded recitation-rooms in the main building.

In athletics there has been a decided gain. The Base-Ball season closed last year after a very successful campaign. The prospect for this Spring is even more promising. The services of Mr. C. J. Ferguson of the Philadelphia League team were procured for several weeks, and under his skillful coaching the men have trained very faithfully. In the Inter-Collegiate Tennis Tournament, held in New Haven last Fall, Trinity won first place in singles and second place in doubles. The prospect for holding our position in Tennis is very good. On the Foot-Ball field last Fall, the college team made a very good record. Several games were played, and considering the strength of the opposing teams we have reason to feel proud of the result. Trinity has taken prominent part in the establishing of the New England Inter-Collegiate Athletic Association, of which we hold the presidency. We have also entered the Eastern Inter-Collegiate Foot-Ball League, recently formed.

And now, before laying aside the editorial pen, we would say "Farewell, '87." They have given to athletics a wonderful impetus, and have proved true sons of Alma Mater. May we have many more such classes, when they shall have gone from us. To the Freshman class we would say: "You have entered strong, and worked well. Grow stronger; work harder."

Finally we commend our book to its readers in the words of the editors of the First Folio:

"Well! it is now publique, and you will stand for your priuileges, wee know: to read, and censure.
Do so, but *buy it firſt*. That doth best commend a Booke, the Stationer faies."

Requirements for Admission.

I. COURSE IN ARTS.

Candidates for admission to the Freshman Class are examined in the following books:

GREEK.

Grammar (Hadley or Goodwin).

Xenophon: *Anabasis*, four Books.

Homer: *Iliad*, three Books, with Prosody.

Prose Composition (Jones or White: the exercises in the first half of the Book).

History of Greece.

[The translation of average passages, not previously read, from Xenophon and Homer will be accepted as an alternative to the above-mentioned quantities in these authors.]

LATIN.

Grammar.

Caesar: *Gallic War*, four Books.

Virgil: *Aeneid*, six Books, with Prosody.

Cicero: the *Orations against Catiline*, and that for the Poet Archias.

Prose Composition: Translation into Latin of a passage of connected English narrative, based upon some passage in Cæsar's *Gallic War*.

Roman History: Outlines, to the death of Marcus Aurelius (Creighton).

Ancient Geography.

Candidates are also examined at sight upon average passages from Cæsar's works, from Virgil's *Aeneid* and Ovid's *Metamorphoses*, and from Cicero's *Orations*, with general questions suggested by the passages.

MATHEMATICS.

Arithmetic, including the Metric System.

Algebra, through Radicals and Quadratic Equations, together with Proportion, Progressions, and the Binomial Theorem.

Plane Geometry.

ENGLISH.

Each candidate is required to write a short English composition, correct in spelling, punctuation, grammar, division by paragraphs, and expression, upon a subject announced at the time of the examination.

In 1887 the subject will be chosen from the following works: Shakspeare's *Julius Cæsar* and *Merchant of Venice*; Johnson's *Lives of Milton and Dryden*; Macaulay's *Essays on Milton and Dryden*; the first two books of Milton's *Paradise Lost*; Dryden's *Alexander's Feast*; Scott's *Quentin Durward*; Irving's *Bracebridge Hall*.

Each candidate will also be required to criticize specimens of English composition.

II. COURSE IN LETTERS AND SCIENCE.

The requirements for admission are the same as in the Course in Arts, with the omission of Greek, Cicero's Orations, and extempore Latin translation.

III. COURSE IN SCIENCE.

Candidates for the Course in Science are examined in the same subjects as those for the Course in Arts, except Greek, Cicero's Orations, and extempore Latin. They are further examined in Algebra as far as the Theory of Equations, in the Geometry of Space, in Plane Trigonometry with its applications to Surveying and Navigation, and in Trench's *Study of Words* and *English Past and Present*.

IV. COURSE IN LETTERS.

The requirements for admission are the same as in the Course in Arts, with the omission of Greek.

Copies of papers used at the Examinations in 1886 are printed at the end of this Catalogue.

Courses of Instruction.

The College offers four Courses of instruction, viz.:

- I. A COURSE IN ARTS.
- II. A COURSE IN LETTERS AND SCIENCE.
- III. A COURSE IN SCIENCE.
- IV. A COURSE IN LETTERS.

The courses extend over four years, with the exception of the Course in Science, which is completed in three years.

Students completing the Course in Arts receive the degree of Bachelor of Arts. Students completing the Course in Letters and Science, or the Course in Science, receive the degree of Bachelor of Science.

Students who do not propose to pursue all the studies of any of the regular courses are permitted, under the name of Special Students, to recite with any class in such studies as, upon examination, they are found qualified to pursue. They are subject to the same rules and enjoy the same privileges as other students; and, upon honorable dismissal, they are entitled to a certificate from the President, stating the studies which they have pursued during their membership in the College.

After the Commencement of 1888, the degree of Master of Arts will be conferred upon Bachelors of Arts of three years standing, who shall, by examination or otherwise, satisfy the Faculty that they have successfully pursued a course of study equivalent to the work of one academic year.
