LIBRARIAN'S REPORT.

Trinity College,

Hartford, Connecticut

To the Trustees of Trinity College:

In accordance with Section Three of Article Fifteen of the Statutes of the College, I submit herewith the report of the Librarian for the year ending June 30, 1923.

The Library has, as in other years, been kept open fifty-four hours per week, and the customary statistics in regard to attendance are given:

These figures present no striking contrasts to those of last year, and warrant no important inferences. They are about what we should expect. The catalogue number of students last year was 263; this year it is 268. The academic year was shortened one week this year because of the Centennial Celebration. So the degree of use of the Library was essentially the same this year as last. It is to be hoped that another year will see a substantial increase.

INCREASE OF THE LIBRARY.

There have been added to the Library during the year 2284 volumes, 1847 pamphlets, 7 maps and 38 manuscripts (letters chiefly from George E. Hoadley, Esquire). Of that 1142 volumes were purchased, all the pamphlets and other items presented. Included among the purchases are 126 volumes of unbound periodicals, four volumes paid for from the appropriation of the Department of History, four paid for from the appropriation of the Departments of Civil Engineering, English, and Chemistry. Of the volumes added to the Library 1540 are bound and 744 unbound. It should be added that the greater part of the periodicals entered as unbound have already been bound or will be bound soon.

The generous appropriation of \$1500 from the income of the Morgan Fund has enabled us to purchase books urgently needed in the work of instruction that without this aid could not have been secured. Practically every Department has shared in this, but particularly the English Department. Here extended purchases in contemporary literature were necessitated by the offering of a course in this period and by the fact that for years we had purchased practically nothing in this field. Without this appropriation under present conditions, we cannot hope to purchase the books imperatively called for by the work of instruction and it is hoped that this appropriation can be continued till our Library Funds are restored to their full income-producing power and till they are substantially increased.

The Foreign Book Fund, subscribed generously by the alumni and friends of the college two years ago, has enabled us to make substantial purchases in French and German Literature. Of this more will be said under that head. Some of the more important purchases of the year other than those

from the Foreign Book Fund may here be mentioned: Furtwangler's "Die Antiken Gemmen", 3 volumes; Westermarck's "History of Human Marriage," 3 volumes; Vigfusson and Powell's "Corpus Poeticum Boreale," 2 volumes; Cambridge History of American Literature, 4 volumes; Mulliken's "Identification of Pure Organic Compounds," 2 volumes; Westerfield's "Banking Principles and Practice," 5 volumes; Glazebrook's "Dictionary of Applied Physics," 3 volumes; Gomperz "Greek Thinkers," 4 volumes; Cambridge History of British Foreign Policy; Loeb Classical Library, 40 volumes; and Emerson's "Journal," 10 volumes.

FOREIGN BOOK FUND.

Purchases have been made from time to time throughout the year from the fund contributed by alumni and friends of the College for the purchase of foreign books until now the fund is entirely expended. It is planned to give a list of the contributors to this fund and a list of the books purchased in a number of the Trinity College Bulletin. This fund has been of the greatest value and your Librarian would again express his grateful appreciation to all who contributed. Among the works purchased during the year may be mentioned: Eustache Deschamps, *Oeuvres completes*, 11 volumes; de Brieux, *Theatre Complet*, 4 volumes; Nivelle de la Chaussee, *Oeuvres*, 5 volumes; Ron-sard, *Oeuvres*, 8 volumes; Marivaux, *Oeuvres completes*, 10 volumes; Destouches, *Oeuvres*, 10 volumes; Brunetiere, *Etudies Critiques*, 8 volumes; Malherbe, *Oeuvres*, 6 volumes; Les *Historiettes de Tallemant des Reaux*, 9 volumes; Augier, *Theatre Complet*, 7 volumes; Taine, *Les Origines de la France Contemporaine*, 10 volumes; Heine, *Werke*, ed. Elster, 7 volumes; Goedeke, *Grundriss zur Geschidre der deut. Dichtung*, 10 volumes; Schiller, *Sämtliche Werke*, Säkular Ausgabe, 16 volumes; Goethe, *Samtliche Werke*, Jubiläums-Ausgabe, 41 volumes; de Maupassant, *Oeuvres Completes*, 16 volumes; Sarcey, *Quarante Ans de Theatre*, 8 volumes; and Dumas, *Theatre Complet*, 15 volumes.

GIFTS.

Appendix II gives the names of donors of the year; to these should be added the names of donors of current periodicals given at the beginning of Appendix I. We are again indebted

to William A. Bird, IV, of the class of 1912 for sending us regularly copies of some important French periodicals, such as "L'Opinion" and "L'Europe Nouvelle."

Some of the gifts for one reason or another call for particular mention.

Thomas Willing Balch, L.H.D., gave us a handsomely bound set of d'Aubigne's "Histoire de la Reformation en Europe" in thirteen volumes, a handsomely bound set of the Second Series of the "Revue de Droit International et de Legislation Comparee" in thirteen volumes, and a number of other useful volumes. James K. Callaghan, '21, gave us sixty-five volumes of Appleton's Science Library, among which were a number of valuable books not in our collection. Charles Henry Carey, Esquire, gave to us a copy of his admirable "History of Oregon". From the estate of the late Professor Edward Williams Morley, Sc.D., we received thirty-nine volumes, chiefly of a scientific nature, though useful dictionaries in several languages were included. The books will be useful and the gift is much appreciated. The Blackstone Memorial Library of Branford, Connecticut, gave us thirty-eight bound volumes of the London "Athenaeum", a "run" going far towards completing our file of this important periodical. Newton C. Brainerd, Esquire, gave us an almost complete file of the "Journal of Egyptian Archaeology". This admirably supplements our file of the "Memoirs" of the Egypt Exploration Society, and in view of the current interest in things Egyptian, is a very welcome gift. From Judge Joseph Buffington, LL.D., '75, we received a copy of the reprint of the only known copy of the 1631 edition of Comenius' "Tertium Catholicum". Since only 200 copies of the reprint are issued, it will itself be a rare book. We are greatly indebted to Judge Buffington for securing a copy for our Library. From Miss Kate A. Skipwith of Oxford, Mississippi, we received a copy of the catalogue of Trinity College for the year 1860-1861 and also an interesting letter from President Samuel Eliot written after he had been elected President, but before he had accepted. From Mrs. Henry Ferguson, we receive regularly periodicals and many miscellaneous items. Her continued interest is greatly appreciated. From Professors Barret, Costello, Kleene, and Perkins, and from Charles G. Woodward, Esquire, '98, gifts of useful books have been received, and to them our thanks are extended. From the offices of the President and the Treasurer numerous items are received from time to time.

We are indebted again to the State Board of Education for the gift of eight bound volumes of Town reports.

We again acknowledge gratefully the gifts of their publications by the Carnegie Institution, the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, The Smithsonian Institute, the Government of the United States, and the State of Connecticut.

CATALOGUING.

The work of the year in this department, in addition to cataloguing current accessions, has been largely reclassifying and recataloguing. Altogether 1574 volumes not previously catalogued have been fully catalogued and shelved. 4904 volumes have been recatalogued and 4886 volumes reclassified. Substantial progress has been made in the work of revising our catalogue, but years will be required for its completion. The work of the year may be summarized:

That is to say, in addition to cataloguing, nearly 30,000 volumes not before catalogued, the recataloguing of over 40,000 volumes has been completed. It is difficult to overestimate the

importance of all this to the users of the Library, for the usefulness of a library depends on the ease with which its contents can be made available.

BINDING.

The appropriation of five hundred dollars (\$500) for binding has been expended largely in binding current periodicals, though progress has been made in binding other material and in "catching up." The binding of the publications of the Carnegie Institution of Washington, given us on condition of our binding and cataloguing them, has been practically completed. An annual appropriation of five hundred dollars (\$500) for binding will enable us to bind new material and gradually catch up, and the continuance of this appropriation is earnestly solicited.

FUNDS.

We are still without income from the Canfield, the Northam, and the Sheffield Funds. Though they are slowly being restored under the care of the Treasurer, it will still be years before their income is available for the purchase of books, and even then our Funds for the purchase of books will be pitifully inadequate. In this situation, the appropriation of \$1500 from the income of the Morgan Fund is as imperative as it is welcome. Books are absolutely necessary for the work of the college, and their cost is much greater than ever before. We must have large additions to our book funds in the near future, and I again commend this subject to the consideration of your honorable body and to the generosity of the friends of the college. In this connection it is a great pleasure to note that during the year Charles Lathrop Pack, LL. D., has increased the Charles Lathrop Pack Library Fund by a gift of \$1000. This Fund now amounts to \$3000; the income is to be used for the purchase of books relating to American History.

A RECOMMENDATION AND A REQUEST.

The growth of the collections of publications of the Government has resulted in filling to overflowing the shelves provided for this material on the top floor of the stack. This condition makes it imperative to put in at the earliest practical moment stacks in the unoccupied portion of this floor. These stacks would provide space for the growth of the collection for a number of years to come. Relief is here urgently needed and it is to be hoped can soon be afforded.

THE STAFF.

Miss Louise M. Bailey, as cataloguer, and Miss Lucy M. Gay, her assistant for part of the year, and Miss Laura Blinn for the rest of the year, have given efficient service in cataloguing and in other work.

The student assistants were Frank S. Jones, Richard Conrad Puels, Harris Henderson Thomas, Henry Wilson Herick, Edmund Franz Singer, N. Ross Parke, and Herbert Joseph Goodrich. Mr. Martin Ferdinand Gaudian has assisted in filing U. S. Government Documents and Mr. Nelson Frederick Adkins, M.A., 1921, has given valuable service in preparing shipments of periodicals for the bindery.

THE LIBRARY COMMITTEE.

To President Ogilby and Professor Carpenter, the resident members of the Library Committee, the Librarian would again express thanks and appreciation for sympathetic interest and valuable aid on every appeal. Their deep interest and special knowledge add constantly to the Librarians' debt to them.

CONCLUSION.

The year has been one of steady work and of gratifying progress and growth. The larger number of books purchased bears testimony to the value of the liberal appropriation of the Trustees, and the progress in cataloguing our possessions is gratifying. Our greatest need continues to be additional Funds for the purchase of books. Since with the completion of the \$1,000,000 Centennial Fund, some of the direst needs of the college are at least alleviated, may we not hope that the attention of friends of the college will be turned to this great need?
