Agenda Items:

Cocktail Party: We decided at the last meeting that a successful party would need to be organized by someone in NYC with support from the staff in Boston. Anyone interested?

Grants:

We have 16 grant proposals and we can give away up to 2,500-3,000 dollars.

1. Parents of Jurupa (riverside CA) - \$150 to repair copier machine.
2. George A. Wiley Center (Pawtucket RI) - \$500 for a second hand mimeograph machine.
3. Citizen Soldier (NY, NY) - Education and publicity campaign about JoAnne Newark case. Any amount
4. Kinehart Inc. (Chicago) - \$384 for leader's guide and resource packet for program on sexuality and homophobia. Postponed from last meeting.
5. Peace Education Project (Somerville MA) - \$500 to develop in-service training project for teachers in the Somerville schools.
6. Philadelphia Aff. Action Center - \$500 for production and distribution of an outreach brochure.
7. Detroit CISPES - \$400 to put together an informational packet on "Labor and Central America".
8. Texas Grassroots Peace Organizing Project (austin Tx) - Any amount to put an organizer on the road in Texas. This was postponed from the last meeting.
9. Food for Free (Cambridge MA) - \$500 to make repairs on van.

10. GLAD (Boston) - \$390 for outreach and education project directed at Lesbian and Gay communities and the legal community.
11. Center on Gov't Repression (Wash D.C.) - \$500 to establish a "fighting government repression" hotline.
12. BAARD (boston) - \$500 for military counseling work
13. Nuclear Free Cambridge (boston) - \$500 seed money for education and fundraising activities in a campaign to make Cambridge a nuclear-free zone.
14. Ad-Hoc Coalition for a Safe Boston Harbor (Boston) - \$500 for campaign against a proposed u.s. naval fleet in Boston Harbor.
15. Cleveland Youth Coalition (Ohio) - \$750 towards campaign to oppose the \$2.50/hr. sub-minimum wage for youth.
16. Artists for Action in Disarmament (Pomfret Center Conn.) - any amount for anti-nuke mural project.

That's all for this meeting. Meredith and I just met with our new accountant and it looks like our books should be together in the future.
