Student Organizations

Asian American Student Association

AASA was created to provide a sense of community to Asian and Asian- American students and others interested in Asian cultures. AASA attempts to promote awareness of the Asian cultures to the Trinity community. AASA is open to both Asian and non-Asian students to participate in a wide spectrum of multicultural and social activities, including films, lectures, dinners, field trips, and the annual Asian Food Festival.



Bantam Brew Club

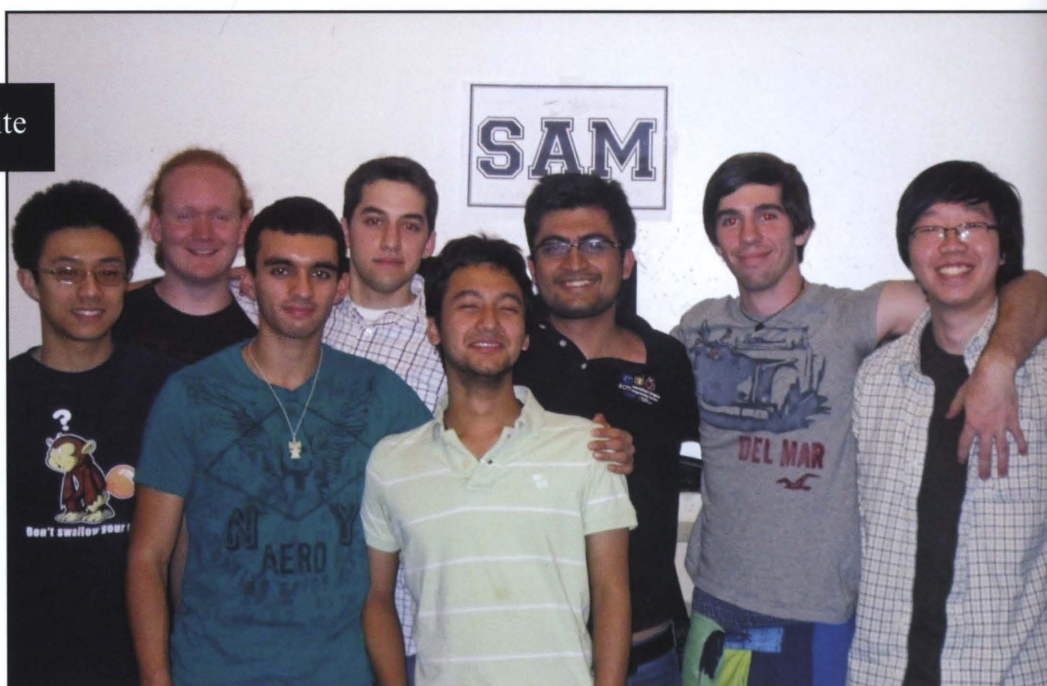
Trinity College Lions Club

The organization creates and fosters a spirit of understanding among people of the College and surrounding Hartford community. To do this, the club promotes the principles of good government and good citizenship, and takes an active interest in the civic, cultural, social, and moral welfare of the community. It also works to unite the members in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship, and mutual understanding. They provide a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest, provided however, that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members. The Science, Allen, and Math (SAM) suite is a themed suite on the Trinity campus. SAM holds tutoring hours weekly and free of charge, giving students an accessible and casual environment where academics can be discussed outside of the classroom, often with upperclassmen they know on a personal level.





Hillel

Hillel is an organization that brings together students in an open forum to discuss issues dealing with Judaism. It also serves to facilitate the observance of Jewish holidays and practices. Hillel schedules regular meetings and creates a social environment for Jewish students on campus.



Relay For Life

Relay for Life is an all-night event held on Trinity's track to raise awareness about cancer, celebrate survivors, remember those who have been lost to cancer, and to raise money for the American Cancer Society. Relay is Trinity's largest student-run fund raiser and one of its largest service events. Nearly 600 members of the Trinity community participate. In its inaugural year, Trinity's Relay raised over \$69,000, placing it in the top five college Relays (per capita) in the country. In 2008, Trinity's Relay for Life team raised over \$62,000 and this year their goal was set even higher. Relay for Life has already raised over \$63,400 is year.



Trinity College Gospel Choir

The Gospel Choir was founded on an inspiration in the fall of 1988. It is a coed singing group, which performs both on campus and in various community events throughout the school year. The choir sponsors two benefit concerts per year for community service organizations in the Greater Hartford area. The approximately twenty member choir rehearses once a week and performs a wide variety of traditional and contemporary gospel music. Everyone is invited to participate; the only requirements are a desire to sing and praise the Lord to the best of one's ability.

Southeast Asia Student Activists

This organization offers those interested in human rights and political activism, another opportunities to get involved protecting those rights. It demonstrates that being a citizen is an active existence transcending mere national identity, and therefore maintains that citizenship goes far beyond altruism or philanthropy.



Trinity College Dance Company

The Trinity College Dance Company, a student dance performance group, was created in 2007 by Lauren Kobernick '10 and Katherine Bibi '10. With the support of Katherine Power, Associate Professor of Theater and Dance, and the entire department, the group has grown into a formidable student organization on campus, ending its third year with a performance of "A Company Affair" to a packed Trinity Performance Lab on back to back nights.



Society of Physics Students

In the 1st annual University Physics Competition, groups of students could choose to analyze one of two problems. Along with 30 other teams, the Trinity trio chose Problem A; 27 teams opted for Problem B. "Aerobraking a Space Probe at Neptune." Three Trinity students, using the principles of physics, spent 48 hours during the weekend of November 6 and 7 tackling a problem with that daunting title. The students were rewarded with a bronze prize for their hard work. Lorenzo R. Sewanan '12, Steve J. Petkovsek '12, and Brandon A. Clary '13, are all physics majors and members of the Society of Physics Students. Their adviser was David Branning, assistant professor of physics.





Amnesty International

The Trinity College chapter of Amnesty International, is a small group of very dedicated student activists working to promote, raise awareness of, and engage the Trinity College campus in local, national, and international human rights' issues through the framework of Amnesty International. It holds a wide range of topic or issue-focused events, brings speakers to campus, runs awareness and letter-signing campaigns, sponsors monthly newsletters and film screenings, and works with Hartford-area and other Trinity organizations.



Trinity Film Society

Trinity Film Society is a club that seeks to bring all film lovers and movie buffs together in order to talk about film as well as put on film-related events around campus. Its connection with Cinestudio presents it with the rare opportunity to be able to put on events in a working movie theater and also to bring in films to show to both Trinity students and the Hartford community.



Banquet

Banquet is a non-denominational student-led service held each Tuesday night at 9:30 p.m., in the Friendship Chapel. Although the Banquet service uses resources from the Episcopal tradition, it is decidedly open to all people, regardless of their faith.

The service includes a scripture reading and thoughts offered through a student, prayer, and the Holy Eucharist led by the Chaplain. Contemporary worship songs are sprinkled throughout.

Trinity College Quirks

Founded in 2003, The Quirks are Trinity's newest all-female a cappella group. The Quirks' repertoire has matured to include a wide range of musical genres, both classic and current. The ladies rehearse four nights a week, Sunday through Wednesday, and perform at various events on and off campus each semester. Quirks hold auditions at the beginning of each semester following the Freshmen Concert.



Men of Color Alliance

The purpose of MOCA is to unify all men of color on campus and to increase the awareness of its members and other Trinity students to the issues pertaining to men of color. These issues can be academic, political, and social. With discussion about these issues, men of color will develop support systems between themselves and the rest of the Trinity Community. MOCA does not discriminate on the basis of race, sexual orientation, or religion. All students who are interested in the organization are encouraged to join.



Stop The Raids

Individualized Degree Program Association

The association offers a first-rate education at an affordable cost. IDP students receive up to 35% reduction in tuition. They master the fundamental skills that last a lifetime - how to think, how to learn, and how to communicate, and prepare themselves for success in whatever they decide to do. They study with professors who are devoted, inspiring teachers who bring their passion for teaching to the classroom. Because of the college's small size, students have the opportunity to know their professors personally and establish one-to-one working relationships with them.



Habitat For Humanity

Habitat for Humanity works in partnership with people everywhere from all walks of life to develop communities for people in need by building and renovating houses. Through its efforts, it makes it possible for people to live in decent houses in decent communities where every person can live and grow.



Cleo of Alpha Chi Literary Society

The CLEO Literary Society was founded at Trinity College in 1877 when the college moved to Vernon Street. This is a co-ed literary society heavily involved in EROS (the Gay/Straight alliance on campus). The Cleo house is often the location for many EROS-themed parties. Their members are also involved in Habitat for Humanity, student government, Sexual Assault Task Force, and the Slate Literary Magazine. Its mission is to engage in service to the community, its peers, and Trinity College.

Zeta Omega Eta

With a specific interest in feminism and community service, this inclusive organization has grown over the past three years to around 50 members. As of 2005, it is the only active feminist sorority in the United States. The alpha chapter of the Sisterhood of Zeta Omega Eta was started at Trinity College in 2003 by then Sophomore Meghan Boone ('06) as part of a tutorial project in 2003.



Mock Trial

The Mock Trial program is an academic competition team that is a member of the American Mock Trial Association ("AMTA" - www.collegemocktrial.org). In September of each year, over 400 colleges and universities nationwide receive a case packet detailing an accident or crime committed in the fictional state of Midlands. All participating schools then spend the next five months preparing their team to litigate the case at competition.





Caribbean Students' Association

The Caribbean Students' Association (CSA) is geared to educate and celebrate the Caribbean culture. Its mission is to provide an environment in which Caribbean and non-Caribbean students experience an exchange of culture and begin to create dialogue about what it means to be Caribbean in the United States. With Hartford's large population of Caribbean people, the organization strives to fill the social gap between Trinity and its neighbors with events open to everyone. It makes an effort to provide aid to Caribbean countries through fund raisers. Every year CSA pushes to gain more exposure and expand its general-body membership so that it can create a legacy on campus.



Trinity College Men's Club Lacrosse Team

This year was the second year for the Men's Club Lacrosse Team, founded in 2010. Last year there were 40 members who played 8 games in the NECLL.
