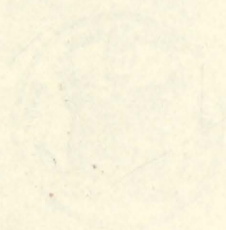

# LIBRARIAN'S REPORT.

*Trinity College,*

*Hartford, Connecticut*

*To the Trustees of Trinity College:*

In accordance with Section Three of Article Fifteen of the Statutes of the College, I submit herewith the report of the Librarian for the year ending July 30, 1927.

As in other years, the Library has been kept open fifty-four hours per week, and the usual statistics in regard to attendance are given:

These figures do not indicate any considerable change in the use of the Library by the students, and probably none need be expected while the methods of instruction remain the same. The decrease in the total attendance is smaller than the decrease in the number of students, due perhaps to a greater use of the Library by the freshmen, whose scholastic record is superior to the scholastic record of the freshmen of last year.

### INCREASE OF THE LIBRARY

During the year, there have been added to the Library 3730 volumes, 2522 pamphlets, 4 manuscripts, and one medal. Of these 1530 volumes were purchased; all the pamphlets and 2200 volumes were presented. Included in the purchases are 123 volumes of unbound periodicals and 6 volumes paid for by the Departments of Civil Engineering, German, and Philosophy. Through the kindness of President Ogilby 92 volumes from the Library of the late Professor Frederic Walton Carpenter were purchased from the profits of the College Book Store. Through his kindness, also, the volumes of the *Chemisches Zentralblatt* from 1919, needed to complete our file, were purchased with money from the same source. Of the volumes added to the Library, 2408 are bound and 1322 unbound. It should be added that some twenty-five unbound volumes and most of the volumes of unbound periodicals have already been bound or will be bound during the summer.

The generous appropriation from the income of the Morgan Fund has been most helpful; indeed without it, it would have been impossible to secure the books essential to the work of instruction. The purchases include a considerable number of books of source material relating to the World War purchased with the income from the Balch Fund, and a goodly number of books dealing with American History purchased from the income of the Pack Fund.

The securing of other such Funds for the purchase of books relating to special fields is much to be desired. We need, for example, a large fund the income of which should be used for the purchase of Chemical periodicals. A considerable number of volumes were purchased in the effort to secure for the Library all the books included in Professor Costello's Reading List. It is intended to continue purchases of this sort during the coming year.

Some of the more important purchases of the year are: Cambridge Ancient History, Vol. 4; *Die Grosse Politik der Europäischen Kabinette 1871-1914*, some 40 volumes; *History of the Peace Conference of Paris*, 6 vols; the Pageant of America,

15 volumes; Feldmarschall Conrad, *Aus meiner Dienstzeit*, 7 vols; Proceedings of the Massachusetts Historical Society, to complete our file, 45 vols; Stobeei Anthologia, 5 vols; Heath's Thirteen Books of Euclid's Elements; Graux's *Histoire des violations des traité de Paix*, 3 vols; Jules Le Maitre, *Les Contemporains*, 7 vols; Helmholtz's *Treatise on Physiological Optics*, 3 vols; Hanotaux, *Histoire de la Nation française*, 15 vols; Arthur K. Porter, *Medieval Architecture*; Bishop, *Theodore Roosevelt and His Time*, 2 vols; Showerman, *Eternal Rome*, 2 vols; Diaries of George Washington, ed. Fitzgerald, 4 vols; Gideon Welles Diary, 3 vols; History of North America, ed. G. Carlton Lee, 20 volumes; Odell, *Annals of the New York Stage*, 2 vols; Fenollosa, *Epochs of Chinese and Japanese Art*, 2 vols; and *Petites Monographies des grands edifices de la France*, 34 vols.

### GIFTS

Appendix II gives the names of the donors of the year; to these should be added the names of the donors of current periodicals given at the beginning of Appendix I. We are again indebted to Mrs. Henry Ferguson, to Dr. Isbon T. Beckwith, to Charles G. Woodward, '98, and Judge Joseph Buffington, '77, to Professors Perkins, Kleene, Costello, Spaulding, and other members of the Faculty for their constant remembrance of the Library.

From William G. Mather, of the Class of 1877, we received a copy of a most interesting little monograph on the "Mather Literature", written by Mr. Thomas J. Holmes, Librarian of the William Gwinn Mather Library, and privately printed by Mr. Mather. The book is a beautiful specimen of the book-making art, and we are fortunate to have a copy in our Library.

From the Rev. William A. Beardsley, D.D., of the Class of 1887, we received some 500 Journals of various Dioceses and Missionary Districts, a gift helping much to keep our collection of diocesan journals up to date.

From Dr. William N. C. Carlton, L.H.D., 1915, we received some 265 volumes, 171 of them bound. The gift included many useful books including a number of volumes of modern French literature, biographies, fiction, etc. Dr. Carlton's continued interest in the Library, which owes so much to his wisdom and knowledge, is gratefully appreciated.

From the library of Professor Charles Frederick Johnson, Professor of English from 1883 to 1906, when he became Emeritus Professor, we received some 124 volumes, including a considerable number of useful books in several fields of literature.



From Robert Hall Symonds, we received a copy of his monograph entitled "Ecclesiastical Shields for the interior of Churches; How the coat of arms and the seal of the Diocese of Connecticut were obtained." Mr. Symonds was active in securing a grant of arms for the Diocese of Connecticut from the Herald's College in England, the first granted to any Diocese in the United States, and his book tells the story most interestingly, with a wealth of heraldic lore and of ecclesiastical history and legend.

From Richardson Wright, of the Class of 1910, Editor of House and Garden, we received copies of two of his books published within the year — "House and Garden's Second Book of Gardens", and "Hawkers and Walkers in Early America". Mr. Wright has a record of a book a year since his graduation, all of high quality, and these add much to his reputation. His "Hawkers and Walkers" is a valuable monograph on some phases of American social history and customs. It shows extensive research and unusual ability to synthesize and present results in literary English of high quality.

We acknowledge again, very gratefully, the gifts of their publications by the Carnegie Institution, the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, the Smithsonian Institution, the Government of the United States, and the State of Connecticut. We are again indebted to the State Board of Education for eight bound volumes of Town reports.

## CATALOGUING

The work of the year in this department has been largely devoted to cataloguing recent accessions. In addition, much time has been given to reclassifying and recataloguing. The checking of the titles in the Union List of Periodicals has taken considerable time. Happily the next year will see this important undertaking completed. 2153 volumes not before catalogued have been catalogued and shelved. 98 books have been recatalogued and 468 reclassified.

### BINDING

As usual, the greater part of the appropriation for binding has been spent in binding current periodicals. However, the small balance available after this has been done, enables us to bind other material. Slowly we are catching up in this highly important work. It is requested that this appropriation be continued.

### FUNDS

Again your Librarian would call attention to the pressing need of new Library Funds. At least \$100,000 of additional endowment is needed to enable us to purchase books and periodicals to enable us to maintain our relative place among New England college libraries. With the aid of the appropriation made from the Morgan Fund, the continuation of which is requested, we are able to purchase the books most insistently demanded in the work of teaching, but we are not able to subscribe for many periodicals much needed. In a word, we live from hand to mouth. We cannot make large purchases and cannot buy sets of periodicals, several of which, for example, are greatly needed by the Department of Chemistry. Is it too much to hope that friends of the College will meet this great need at no very distant day?

### STAFF

Miss Louise M. Bailey as Cataloguer, and Miss Laura A. Blinn as Assistant, have given faithful and efficient service.

The Student Assistants have been Harold William Gale, Royden Constantine Berger, Roland Templeton Jennings, George Reginald Turney, Glenn Elmer McNitt, Louis Frank Rowe, and Herbert Edwin Snow. Mr. Gale has been an efficient first assistant, and having graduated, he will be much missed next year.



## THE LIBRARY COMMITTEE

The resident members of the Library Committee, President Ogilby and Professor Costello, have been very much interested and most helpful. Mr. Kane and Mr. Fisher have attended meetings of the Committee when in the city for meetings of the Trustees, and have given valuable counsel and advice. The death of Mr. Fisher is a great loss to the Committee, of which he had been a member many years. He had given many valuable books, and had assisted in raising money for the purchase of books at times when unusually large purchases were particularly needed. He will be greatly missed and his services to the Library will be long remembered.

## CONCLUSION

The year has been one of progress. The work of cataloguing is measurably completed. We have been able to purchase rather more books than usual. Again your Librarian ventures to hope that before the end of the summer the long awaited and much needed new stacks will be placed on the top floor. Our greatest need is a large addition to our funds for the purchase of books and periodicals; this we must have if we are to make any systematic attempt to fill gaps or to secure greatly needed large series, such as the *Monumenta Germaniae Historica*, and sets of periodicals. Your Librarian hopes, then that in the not distant future, these with many other good things, will come to the College.
