REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN

July 2, 1934

To the Trustees of Trinity College:

In accordance with Section Three of Article Fifteen of the Statutes of the College, I submit herewith the report of the Librarian for the year ending June 30, 1934.

The Library has been kept open fifty-nine hours per week,

and the usual statistics in regard to attendance are given:

Again, in spite of a slight increase in enrollment, we have to chronicle a small decrease in attendance as compared with the preceding years. Why this is so, is not apparent. The figures for the year 1931-32, for some reason were abnormally high. Leaving that year out of account, the figures for the present year are about what might be expected.

GRANT FROM THE CARNEGIE CORPORATION

We have purchased during the year with the Grant from the Carnegie Corporation 675 volumes. This number is smaller than the number purchased last year, both because the volumes purchased have been more expensive, and also because a smaller proportion of the books ordered on this year's allotment have arrived than had at this time a year ago, the year not closing till October.

I can add nothing to my expression of appreciation of the usefulness of this generous grant to what has been said, in earlier reports. It is impossible to exaggerate the value and usefulness of it.

The present grant expires in one more year, though naturally we hope the Carnegie Corporation may see fit to continue the policy of making these grants to college libraries and hope we may share in any new grants that may be made.

The uncertainty, however, brings home to us the imperative need of new endowment funds, the income of which is to be expended for the purchase of books and periodicals. We need not less than \$200,000 for this purpose.

INCREASE OF THE LIBRARY

During the year, there have been added to the Library 7,456 volumes and 5477 pamphlets, a total of 12,933 items. Of these 2225 volumes were purchased. All the pamphlets and 5231 volumes were presented. Included in the purchases are 209 volumes of unbound periodicals and the 675 volumes purchased with the grant from the Carnegie Corporation. Of the volumes added to the Library, 5,709 are bound and 1,747 unbound. It should be added that most of the volumes of unbound periodicals and many of the other volumes will be bound during the summer.

It is obvious, of course, that but for the generous grant of the Carnegie Corporation and the generous appropriation of the Trustees from the income of the Morgan Fund, we should be unable to purchase even the books essential to the proper carrying on of the work of instruction. Books, and especially periodicals, cost much more and many more of them are demanded than were called for ten years ago. Growth in the number of students and faculty will still further strain our slender resources.

Among the more important purchases of the year may be mentioned: Dictionary of American Biography, 12-13; Encylopedia of the Social Sciences, 11-12; Enciclopedia Italiana, 1-20; Beilstein's Handbuch der organischen Chemie, 11-14; American Literature, 1-5; History of the State of New York, 1-2; Grenfell and Hunt, Oxyrhynchus Papiri, 4-13; Collitz, Sammlung der Griechischen Dialekt-inschrift, 1-4; Breasted, Ancient Records of Egypt; Workman, John Wycliff; Yellow Book, 1-13; Larousse du XX° Siècle, 1-6; Walde, Vergleichendes Worterbuch der indogermanischen Sprachen, 1-3; Handbuch der Experimentalphysik, 16-17; Webb, English Local Government, 1-9; Pastor, History of the Popes, 7-22; Janssen, History of the German People, 1-16; Makers of Canada, 1-12; Gautier, Théophile, Works (English translation), 1-24; Voltaire, Works (English translation), 1-42; and Lalande, Vocabulaire de la Philosophie, 1-3.

GIFTS

Appendix II gives the names of donors during the year; to them should be added the names of donors of current periodicals given in Appendix I.

The largest single gift, of the year was made by President Ogilby, who from the profits of the Book store, purchased for the Library the professional library of Dr. John Austin Spaulding, formerly Professor of German in the College. The collection contained upward to 2,000 volumes, and strengthens vastly the resources of the Library in this important field. The value and quality of the gift may be inferred from only a few of the titles. such as the great Weimar edition of Goethe in 140 volumes; the Goethe Jahrbuch, 1880-1913; Kürschner's Deutsche National Litteratur, in 200 volumes, invaluable for its scholarly critical introductions; and the Allgemeine Deutsche Biographie, the great German biographical dictionary in 56 volumes. The collection is especially rich in editions of works by Goethe and in books about him. Altogether this is one of the most significant additions made to the Library in years. Another valuable gift was the bequest of her library by Miss Mary Frances Rearden, of West Hartford. It should also be gratefully noted that she left to the College \$5,000, the income to be used for library purposes. This gift included upward of 1,200 volumes, and consists almost entirely of the best modern works in the fields of literature and literary criticism. It adds to the Library many books in excellent editions which we very much needed, and also many serviceable second-copies of books much in demand. Miss Rearden was a lady of culture, who read widely and discriminatingly and we are indeed grateful for her generous thought of the College and of the Library especially.

Some other gifts for one reason or another call for special mention.

Mrs. B. H. Buckingham, of Cornwall, Pennsylvania, through the good offices of President Ogilby, gave some forty volumes of "Fliegende Blätter", handsomely bound in twenty volumes. Mrs. Bern Budd Gallaudet, widow of the late Bern Budd Gallaudet, M.D., of the Class of 1880, gave us some fifty volumes from his library. Josiah Kirby Lilly gave us a collection of reproductions of the original editions of the Music of Stephen Collins Foster, gathered into three portfolios and housed in a steel cabinet, a very welcome addition to our growing music collection. The National Research Council gave us some fifty of their valuable publications in the physical sciences, for which we are grateful. The Library of Princeton University gave us Vols. X and XI of "Contributions from the Princeton Biological Laboratories", in continuation of former gifts. Henry D. B. Moore, Esquire, of Norfolk, gave us some thirty useful volumes, also in continuation of former gifts. Dr. Roger H. Motten gave us a "History of the Art of Writing" in four volumes, an interesting and useful paleographical work that we are very glad to add to the Library.

Of the Trustees, Messrs. Brainard, Buffington, Woodward, and Wright have made much appreciated gifts, Mr. Wright giving us copies of his two latest books.

The names of the members of the Faculty will be found in the list of donors, including Professors Bissonnette, Costello, Kleene, Shepard, and Wadlund, Professor Shepard giving us a copy of his edition of selected poems of Longfellow.

In few years have the gifts exceeded the gifts of this year in number and value. They are a striking evidence of the interest of the friends of the College in the Library, and call for our appreciation and gratitude.

We acknowledge again with grateful appreciation the gifts of their publications by the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching, the Carnegie Institution of Washington, the Smithsonian Institution, the State of Connecticut, and the Government of the United States. We are also indebted to the Connecticut State Board of Education for eight unbound volumes of Town reports.

CATALOGUING

The unusual number of books added to the Library during the year has made the work in the cataloguing department unusually heavy. It has been done, however, cheerfully and well. Mr. Tobin has contributed much to this result both directly and by releasing Miss Bailey and other members of the staff for greater attention to the cataloguing. Our staff is still very inadequate, and we must soon add at least one more trained helper.

BINDING

As usual, the greater part of the appropriation for binding has been spent in caring for current periodicals. Still, the funds available enable us to bind a considerable number of other volumes. It is of the greatest importance that the appropriation be continued and, if possible, even increased.

FUNDS

The need for new Funds has been spoken of in the paragraph of this Report dealing with the Grant from the Carnegie Corporation. In a word, we need not less than \$200,000, the income of which is to be used for the purchase of books and periodicals. We need also funds for administration to enable us to increase the staff to keep pace with the growth of the collection and with the increase in the number of faculty and students.

Grateful mention should here be made of the bequest of \$5000 by the late Miss Mary Frances Rearden, of West Hartford, the income of which is to be used for library purposes.

Additional room in the Library building for proper working quarters and for additional stacks is an imperative necessity. Placing steel shelving in the basement room under the offices and the removal of the Government publications from the top floor of the stacks to this space, would relieve the congestion for a few years, two or three at the most at the present rate of growth. The only possible solution of the problem is the enlargement of the building to provide space for additional stacks. When this is done, and it must be done soon, room for not less than 500,000 volumes should be provided. Libraries always grow far beyond calculations.

THE STAFF

Miss Louise M. Bailey, as Cataloguer, and Mrs. Harold Schatz, as Assistant, as always have given faithful and highly commendable service. Mr. James Golden Tobin, as General Assistant, or "man of all work", is invaluable. His interest, industry, and intelligence cannot be too highly commended.

THE LIBRARY COMMITTEE

Your Librarian takes this occasion to express his appreciation of the interest and helpfulness of the members of the Library Committee. President Ogilby is always more than willing to discuss problems and to give counsel and advice. His gift of money from the profits of the Book Store for the purchase of the Spaulding library is only one, though perhaps the largest, of several such gifts. Professor Costello gives largely of his time for the selection of books, especially perhaps, of those to be purchased on the Carnegie Grant. He is invaluable. Professor Allen and Professor Bissonnette make helpful suggestions from time to time as to purchases or in regard to matters of administration. Their interest and services merit the gratitude of all who use the Library.

CONCLUSION

At present, with the aid of the Grant of the Carnegie Corporation, the needs of the College, both students and faculty, for new books and periodicals are being more nearly met than ever before. But we need new Funds, we need additions to the Staff, and we need more room for both workers and books. These things simply must be provided if the Library is to meet as nearly as it is doing at present the needs of those who depend on the Library for the successful carrying on of their work, to say nothing of meeting those needs more adequately. We can but hope earnestly that the Friends of the College will meet these great needs at no very distant day.
