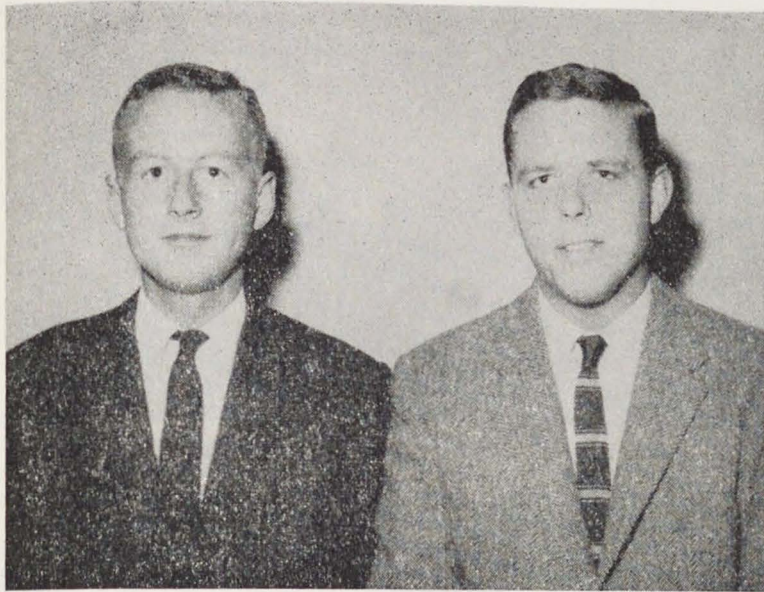

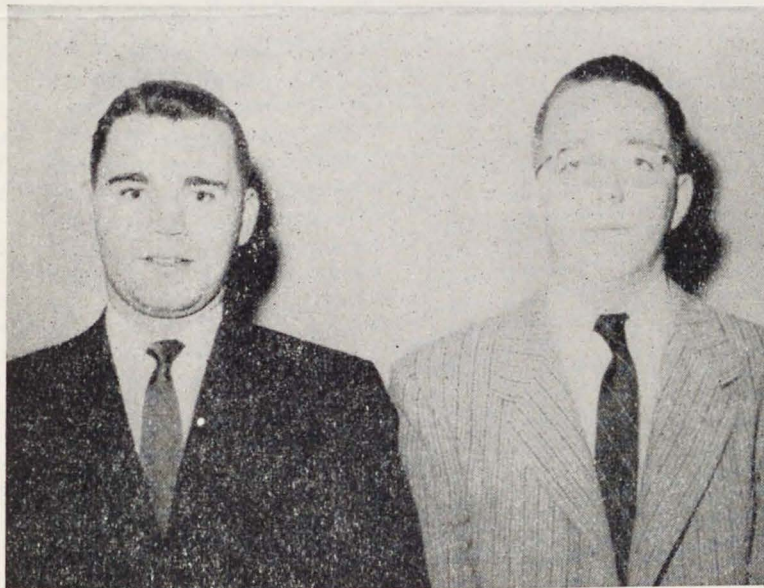
Derek Pershouse

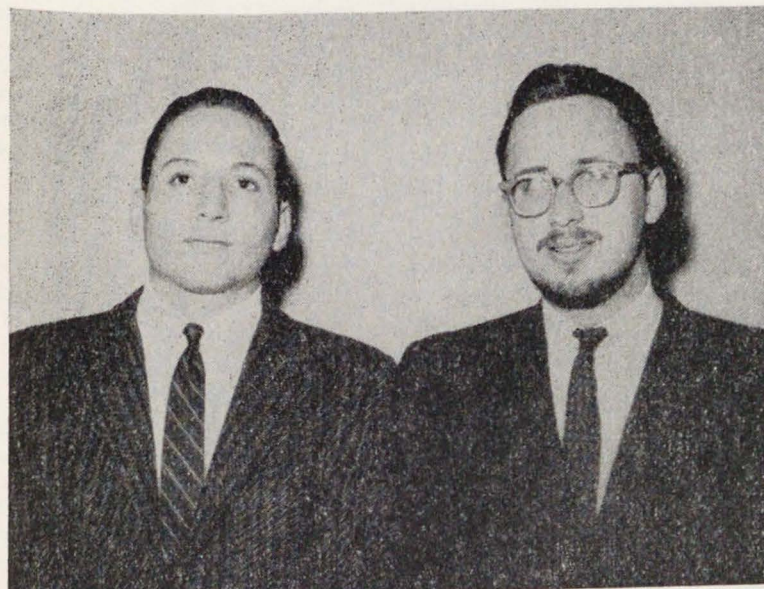
